Yosemite National Park

- Glaciation while hiking glacier-formed waterfalls
- Ecological relationships from the perspective of a 2,000-year-old giant sequoia tree
- Geology laid bare along granite monoliths and domes

Golden Gate National Recreation Area

- Watershed ecology through examining macroinvertebrates in local ponds
- Adaptations of tide pool creatures in an intertidal marine touch tank
- Climate change and phenology while tracking plant cycles throughout the year

Olympic National Park

- Environmental restoration and recovery following dam removal on the Elwha River
- Climate trends and their impacts on local species
- Old-growth temperate rainforest and alpine peaks

Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area

- Biogeography in action in the rare Mediterranean ecosystem
- Stewardship and conservation through litter analysis and phenology
- The Arroyo Sequit watershed from its start near Sandstone Peak to where it meets the ocean


Channel Islands National Park


- Marine ecosystems while collecting data on marine protected areas

National Environmental Science Center in Yosemite National Park

Environmental science education reimagined

The future of environmental science education begins with our project in Yosemite: the National Environmental Science Center. Creating the next generation of environmental stewards isn't just a goal—it's at the very core of our existence.

It's been a topic around campfires and in leadership meetings over the last 35 years. And now? Our state-of-the-art environmental science center at Yosemite National Park is under construction.

A resounding example of our strategic plan's adage "be excellent, build the field," the National Environmental Science Center will provide a permanent home for environmental science programs in Yosemite that will showcase the wonder of our natural world for young people across the nation.

The need couldn't be more urgent. Today, children and teens suffer from nature deficit disorder, spending less than seven minutes outside each day. At our center, students and community members will spend at least eight hours a day on nature and science learning—in the heart of one of our country's iconic outdoor landscapes.

A global model for field-based learning, the center will significantly increase the current capacity for year-round field science programs for children and teens. Multiday residential science programs at the NatureBridge center will provide space, tools, technology, and educators to inspire curiosity and confidence.

Grounds will include cabins for students, classrooms, a library, a dining hall, bathhouses, and more. The center will serve as a laboratory for environmental education best practices, convene thought leaders, and spark innovation.

There, kids and guests alike can learn and dream—shaping their own campfire ambitions that will form tomorrow's future.




